WHAT IS KALEIDOSCOPE PLAY & LEARN



Facilitated play group for young children and their family, friend and neighbor caregivers and/or parents

KALEIDOSCOPE PLAY & LEARN'S DISTINGUISHING FACTORS



- A trained facilitator who plans, sets up and participates in each KP&L session
- Recruiting and engaging Family, Friend and Neighbor caregivers to participate
- Weekly sessions of 90 minutes or more
- Open-ended, child-directed and culturally-appropriate "free" play
- Coordinated group activity (i.e. circle time with books and songs)
- Caregiver learning about how children learn through play and other topics, such as child development, health and nutrition, early literacy and early math
- Opportunities for caregivers to get to know one another and build supportive relationships
- Opportunities for caregivers to develop leadership and to guide the group


For Caregivers, Kaleidoscope Play & Learn:

- Is a *group* experience rather than a classroom situation
- Encourages *active* participation
- Is a place to *practice* new ideas and skills
- Uses *sharing* and conversation among other participants
- Is a place for *support* and recognition



Key Messages to Caregivers from Kaleidoscope Play & Learn

- Caregivers have an important role in children's development and early learning.
- Children learn through play, relationships, and interaction.
- Children don't need expensive toys or equipment to play and learn.
- Everyday activities are full of "teachable moments."




Facilitator Techniques to Support Caregiver Learning


- Modeling:



- 1:30PM- 3:00 PM






Parents, Caregivers & Children Learning Together

- Parents and caregivers are looking for educational resources, access to professional development, connection to a network of adults working and caring for children and strategies to help support children and families.
- 79% of parents and caregivers reported they gained skills to support their children & family and gained confidence as caregivers through Playgroups.
- "We love you guys!" parent/caregiver



One Year Strong!

- Playgroup Attendance (Unduplicated):
 - 200 parents & caregivers (12 grandparents)
 - 226 children
- Total Attendance (Duplicated Count):
 - 773 parents & caregivers
 - 1,026 children
- Average Attendance: 4 Playgroups
- Participants come from all over San Francisco and the Bay Area to our weekly Kaleidoscope Playgroup



What have we learned from Kaleidoscope?



- We adapt activities and learning opportunities to respond to children's and their caregivers' interest.
 - Based on feedback we have integrated more dance, movement, singing, and construction activities, we also post a schedule for each Playgroup.
- We have seen the positive impact of consistency through offering weekly Playgroups.
 - The class has grown from 1-2 participants (in our pilot phase) to an average of 20+ participants.
- Each week we share resources and program information with our participants to support their child development knowledge and professional skills.

Keep on Playing!!!

- 67% of our Playgroup participants reported increased child development skills, techniques and strategies, social emotional competence and knowledge of parenting and caregiving.
- 66% reported increased nurturing and attachment to their children, as a result of Kaleidoscope.
- Parents and caregivers are resilient. We see how all want to provide the best environment possible for their children and family.
- Playgroups support Children's Council to deepen our community relationships as well as our participants' leadership.
