

TRAINING WILL COVER

Protections for Persons from Other Countries and LEP

- Agencies that receive federal financial assistance may NOT discriminate based on race, color, or national origin.
- Agencies must take reasonable steps to provide limited English proficient (LEP) individuals with meaningful access to their programs.
- California law requires bilingual access.

Immigrants and Child Care Eligibility

State Funded Child Care or Public Ed Programs:

NO restrictions: "eligibility for child care services shall be without regard to immigration status" of parent or child, unless child or parent under a final order of deportation. 5 Cal.Code Regs. § 18107(d).

Protecting Client Information

- All family info collected shall be confidential;
 only used/disclosed for direct program reason
- Inform families they do not need to give SSN

.... If you do not wish to give your Social Security Number for this purpose, you may still receive child care assistance....

Public Charge Issues



- Current Law: receipt of subsidized child care is not considered in "public charge" determinations.
- Proposed Trump Executive Order: Would potentially count all federally funded benefits (including non-cash) based on income. in public charge determination.
- Not Signed or Implemented Even if signed into law, should not apply to benefits received before the law changed.

- You are a key entry point for families seeking legal help/referrals to agencies
- List of Agencies that help address immigration concerns; some with a focus on children
- Know Your Rights Information in multiple languages
 - In one's own home or on the street
 - For employers in their place of business

Summary of Key Points

- Immigrant status doesn't matter for child care eligibility
- Child care providers play a key role in providing safe environment for children during difficult times
- California is not following Washington: CA working to protect immigrant communities; protecting confidential information
