Budget TBL passed **July 1, 2109.** CDSS guidance issued Oct. 1? <u>SB 80</u> (Budget bill that incorporated SB 321), and <u>AB 121</u>

CalWORKs Child Care



CalWORKs Child Care

- Stage 1 Administered by CDSS/CWD's. Historically tied to current WTW activity or work
- Stage 2 Once "stable" and for 24 months following date parent last received cash aid or diversion; CDE
- Stage 3 After 24th month; can only enter directly from Stages 1 or 2; no time limit; CDE



Legislative Intent



Child Care for Recipients of the CalWORKs Program Ed. Code § 8350.

(a) It is the intent of the Legislature...to ensure that recipients of [CalWORKs] aid ... and former recipients who have left aid for employment, are connected as soon as possible to local child care resources, make stable child care arrangements, and continue to receive subsidized child care services after they no longer receive aid as long as they require those services and meet the eligibility requirements...

New! Immediate and continuous Stage 1 child care



□ As of October 1, 2019, families will get:

- Child care authorized immediately upon CalWORKs approval;
- Authorization for 12 months or until transfer to the Stage 2 program;
- Child care to attend Welfare-to-Work (WTW) activities or work; and
- Child care so that parents can tend to a broad set of family needs. "Program activities" include: housing search, domestic violence, addiction or mental health counseling, court and medical appointments, and other similar activities;

New! Immediate and continuous Stage 1 child care (continued)



□ As of October 1, 2019, families will get:

- Full-time child care, unless a parent decides part-time care better meets their family's needs;
- Child care for adults who have been sanctioned and indicate an intent to participate in any program activity;
- Child care for exempt volunteers who choose to participate in any program activity; and,
- County must verify that the parent has actually secured child care before they need to show up for required activities or welfare appointments

ACL 19-XXX

Expanded Program Activities



- Full-time Stage 1 child care authorized for broad set of activities, including:
 - any WTW activity, orientation, appraisal, assessment, job search, job club, etc.
 - domestic violence services, court appearances
 - housing search or classes, homeless support programs, shelter participation requirements, eviction proceedings
 - mental health services (including therapy or personal counseling), home visiting programs, drug or substance abuse services, parenting classes
 - medical or education-related appointments for the participant or their dependents.

New Child Care Request Form



NOTICE: You may be eligible for CalWORKs Stage One Child Care

The county pays for child care for children under 13, and for older children with disabilities up to the age of 21 that prevent them from being left alone.

MY CHILD CARE RIGHTS

- I have a right to child care to tend to my family's needs. For example: housing search, domestic violence or mental health counseling, court and medical appointments, or other similar activities.
- My child care will be authorized for 12 months, so that my children get stable, reliable care.
- I have the right to have child care in place before I need to show up for required activities or appointments.
- I have a right to child care so that I can go to any Welfare-to-Work (WTW) activity or work.
- □ I have a right to full-time child care, unless I prefer part-time care.
- I have a right to child care as an exempt volunteer, if I choose to participate in activities.
- □ If I don't want child care now, I can ask for it later.

New! Improved Transfer Process between CaIWORKs stages



CDE <u>Management Bulletin 18-05</u> and <u>ACIN I-19-17</u>
New Ed. Code Sec. 8350 (c):

In order to ensure that there is no disruption in child care services due to the planned transitions between the stages of CalWORKs childcare, the first stage or the second stage of childcare services shall not be discontinued until confirmation is received from the administrator of the subsequent stage of childcare that the family has been enrolled in the subsequent stage of childcare, or that the family is ineligible for services in the subsequent stage of childcare.

SF Pilot Basics

- Began May 2017
- Was requested to align Stage 1 with CDE 24-month eligibility pilot
- Differed from current law in a few ways

Administrative Transactions Declined Significantly



SF Pilot Takeaways

Stage 1 Costs Increased by 20%

- Families weren't being transferred timely to Stage 2
- There were also 2 RMR increases

SF Pilot Takeaways

-Continuous length of Stage 1 authorizations increased from 6-7 months to 13-14 months on average.

• A referral database developed by SalesForce

Why Launchpad?

- HSA already uses Launchpad for other referrals (clothing, counseling etc.)
- Instant info & data for our funders and CW staff
- Integrated Email/Chat feature communication becomes a permanent part of case file.

- Each auth email will come with a Launchpad hyperlink and PDF

Customize Your Launchpad List

After logging in, click Service Activities in the upper right-hand corner. You will use only this tab in Launchpad. To customize the Service Activities list that show for you, choose "Assigned to Me." Use the Thumbtack icon to pin this choice. Next time you login, Services Activities will display only your cases.



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Typical Stage One Information



"Chatter"-Launchpad's Built in Email

If a record is incomplete or has errors, staff communicate through Launchpad's chat feature called Chatter. The communication remains a permanent part of the client's case file within LP.

Immediate and Continuous Child Care Eligibility in CalWORKs Stage One



Background

- Early development is key to future success
- Poverty limits bandwidth and increases incidents of toxic stress
- CalWORKs engagement had room for improvement
- Subsidy child care programs and CalWORKs stages of child care were not aligned



Purpose

Child care as a two-generational approach to poverty reduction Benefit to parents Benefit to children Reduced administrative burden Systems alignment



Policy Implementation

Immediate and continuous child care upon eligibility determination

Full time child care unless individual requests part time

Child care must be authorized and secured before mandating participation in any activities

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

Exceptions

The following groups are not eligible for immediate and continuous child care eligibility in Stage One: Child-only cases (families with no aided adults) Adult(s) receiving SSI benefits Ineligible noncitizen adults Non-needy caretaker relatives Individuals choosing an exemption at cash aid determination



Differences between Stage One and Stage Two Policy

Length of time in a Stage

- Stage One: 12 months or until county defines as "stable"
- Stage Two: No less than 12 months before recertification

Full-time vs Part-time

- Stage One: Full-time child care unless parent requests part time.
- Stage Two: Part time or full time as determined by the parent's need

Differences in Stage One and Stage Two policies remain
